

RECTOR'S REFLECTION

Do you know what the Calendar is? No, I don't mean the annual Canadian Church Calendar that we sell you at the end of the year. I don't even mean the Church Year Liturgical Planner that I put together every fall that has all of the readings etc for the following year. In this case, what I mean is the Calendar of the Church, which is the collection of feasts, commemorations, and memorials that we mark almost every day of the year.

In a small rural parish such as ours, we don't have services throughout the week other than Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday. So, we primarily gather Sunday by Sunday and we observe the readings and intentions of that Sunday, whether it's the First Sunday of Advent, the Third Sunday of Lent, or the Twenty-eighth Sunday after Pentecost. Each Sunday has its own set of readings and prayers and we work according to that lectionary cycle. We know the big feasts and fasts of the Church—Easter, Christmas, Pentecost, Ascension, Epiphany, Trinity Sunday, All Saints' Day, Ash Wednesday, and Good Friday. But there are a multitude of other saints' days and other commemorations that fall on fixed dates. The Calendar is what keeps them all in order.

If you open a *Book of Alternative Services* and turn to page 14, you'll find an explanation of the Calendar. On page 15 begins some lists: Principal Feasts, Sundays, Holy Days, Days of Special Devotion, and Days of Optional Observance. The liturgical cycle for the year is outlined starting on page 18 and then on page 20, it explains what the difference is between a memorial and a commemoration. Not stuff that most people are interested in or care about, but it is part of our tradition, so it might be a learning experience for you to read through all this stuff.

The Calendar itself starts on page 22. Each month has a page and the days of the month are listed down the left side. If there is a holy day, commemoration, or memorial on that day, the title or person is listed in the next column, and then on the right side of the page it tells us what the category of the observance is (i.e. principal feast etc: the legend is on page 21). So, for example, if you turn to page 24 (March) and then look at the entry for the 10th, you'll see that it's a commemoration (Com) of the Most Rev'd Robert Machray, First Primate of Canada, 1904. There are general prayers for people like this in the BAS, but there is another larger book called *For All The Saints* which has particular prayers and readings for those days and, for many of the observances, there is a second section of the book with inspirational excerpts from the writings of the person being commemorated.

If you take a look at two dates of special interest to our parish—April 16th and June 21st—you'll see in most of our copies of the BAS that there is no entry on either date. In new editions of the BAS, those days now read "Mollie Brant (Konwatsitsayenni), Matron among the Mohawks, 1796" and "National Aboriginal Day of Prayer". The Anglican Church of Canada's General Synod in recent years has added both of those dates to the Calendar, which means that the whole Church across the country observes those days.

The real point of me telling you all this: on October 21st, 2012, the Roman Catholic Church canonised St Kateri Tekakwitha, a Mohawk woman from the Valley who eventually died in Kahnawake. She is not part of the Canadian Calendar yet. At our most recent meeting, Parish Council passed a resolution asking the General Synod of Canada to add her to the Calendar in 2016. We hope that, in a year or two, Anglicans across the country will be celebrating another Mohawk woman.
